At the January 6th Recreation Advisory Committee (RAC) the 2020 Work Plan was updated, plans were made to gather a group to organize the kitchen and host a Mother's Day Bingo. The Trailside Café, held here in the hall will be back in business for 5 Saturdays in February. I hope to see you there.

On January 10th, Deputy Mayor Villeneuve and I attended a Site Visit for Local Elected Officials at the Canadian Nuclear Laboratories at Chalk River. It was an opportunity for me to have my first tour of the CNL campus and for Councillor Villeneuve to take a walk down memory lane and see the many changes that have taken place since his retirement.

CNL's President and CEO Mark Lesinski, outlined the CNL Business Update with A Year in Review.
