Subject: Regulating and governing the operation of Snowmobiles on Municipal Roads

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council adopt the following recommendations.

Resolution #1

WHEREAS Council at its meeting of September 11th did give this by-law a first reading and recommended changes which have been completed;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT in order to permit snowmobile use in a safe and controlled manner, and to provide a document which Ontario Provincial Police and any municipal enforcement staff might use to enforce municipal rules, the Council of the United Townships of Head, Clara & Maria does approve the attached by-law number 2018-20, the Snowmobile By-Law as amended to become effective immediately on final passing.

AND FURTHER THAT this by-law be READ a second and third time and finally passed this 16th day of October, 2018.

BACKGROUND/EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

- 1. The consultation which occurred in respect to the use of the Algonquin trail identified some resident dissatisfaction with the current status of uncontrolled use of snowmobiles on municipal roads as well as trespass, littering and disrespect for property owners.
- 2. In order to ensure that respectful controlled use of snowmobiles on municipal roads is legally enforceable by the municipality, a by-law is required.

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- 3. Council has an obligation to the public to ensure public health and safety and enacting a snowmobile by-law will allow council to set times of use and speed limits which the OPP and any municipal enforcement officers in the future may enforce.
- Occasional enforcement will ensure compliance with rules. Fines will offset costs of enforcement.
- 5. They may also choose to restrict access to certain roads if they so choose.
- 6. Staff recommend that all roads be available for respectful, safe use as has been in the past. The only challenge municipal employees ever had with the use of snowmobiles on municipal roads was the speed at which they crossed the roads, at which they travel down the roads and the grooming of municipal roads. The Municipal Act legislates that municipalities must ensure that their roads are maintained to a certain level, and failure to do so will open the municipality up to the Negligence Act. There was never an issue with snow machines travelling respectfully on municipal roads.
- 7. Staff have received some mixed messages but it is general understanding that the MLSC does not wish to have access to the Algonquin Trail along its length due to some sections which are dangerous and will be costly to build and maintain. That may change in the future. It is understood that at this time, they simply wish to use certain sections based on operations on Crown logging roads and how that might affect riders. They too are concerned for the safety of their riders and wish to keep everyone safe.

Options/Discussion: In September 11 report to Council

Financial Considerations - Budget Impact:

Financial considerations would include those for enforcement, advertisement, increased police calls, by-law enforcement. Fines would return revenues to the municipality to offset the costs of by-law enforcement.
