Your Council had a break to enjoy the beautiful summer weather during the month of July. The summer days have flown by! Time never seems to move quite this quickly when it is -20. I am pleased to report on some of the events that have occurred since my June message.

Ms. Fischer, Deputy Mayor Villeneuve and I had an introductory meeting with our regional Red Cross Emergency Management Coordinator, Mr. Jay DeBarnardi on July 25th. It was his first visit to HCM and we were able to discuss many of the unique aspects of our rural location. He also informed us of a “new to me” emergency program offered by the Red Cross. PDA is the Personal Disaster Assistance program available to individuals in need of 72 hours of support in an emergency or personal disaster situation. At the August 15th meeting, Council authorized staff to purchase a debit/credit machine to accept payments in the municipal office. It is our hope that this long awaited service will assist our residents by making necessary financial transactions easier. At the same meeting the Council directed staff to begin the process of entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with Northern Graphite concerning the unopened road allowance at the Bissett Creek mine site.

This year's summer student, Sneh Patel has headed back to university. He worked on and learned many aspects of the municipality's services, among them - the busy summer Lending Hub and assisted staff with the digitization of documents.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

With the sudden closure of Beaumen Waste Management, staff have been working towards a new solution for Blue Box materials in HCM. As of August 20th, 2019, Valley Dumpster has been providing roll-off bins at each landfill site and will transport our material to the Ottawa Valley Waste Recovery Centre (OVWRC), where it will be processed. Recycling streams and sorting requirements are very similar to our old system, but OVWRC has provided an updated guide below. It is important that each resident ensures that their recycling is sorted properly to avoid contamination fees at the OVWRC. If recycling is set out at the curb and is not sorted properly, it may be refused. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the municipal office at 613-586-2526.

Emergency preparedness starts with you **seasonal influenza**

The flu (influenza) is a contagious virus that anyone can get.
Protect yourself and others by recognizing the symptoms.



Wash your hands
with soap and water



Get your annual flu shot

Pandemic refers to an infectious disease that spreads throughout the global population. This differs from an epidemic. While just as serious, an epidemic is usually contained within a region or country. Historically, pandemics have centred on a new strain of influenza. You can prepare now against a potential pandemic by practicing good health habits, including eating well, drinking lots of water, exercising on a regular basis and getting plenty of rest.

Ask your health care provider about getting a seasonal flu shot. An annual flu shot is one of the most effective ways to prevent catching or spreading the flu virus. For more information, please visit the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care.

General Tips

Wash your hands often with soap and water thoroughly for about 15 seconds, including:

- Before and after eating
- After you have been in a public place
- After using the washroom
- After coughing and sneezing
- After touching surfaces that other people also touch.

Prepare Now

Consider adding additional items to your emergency survival kit such as:

- Alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing between 60 and 90 per cent alcohol
- Medicine for headache, cough, and fever (consult with your pharmacist for advice if you buy over-the-counter medicine)
- Thermometer
- Anti-diarrheal medication
- Beverages with electrolytes
